#### Architectural Review Board

Landscape Maintenance:

- Sprinkler System inspected & winterized
- Main Entry Sign light bulbs replaced
- Landscape Maintenance contracts with Monster Yards for: entries, bike trail and open space included fertilization, mowing, edging, mulching, and planting annuals.
- Emails to City of Stow regarding punch list items that need to be completed and street tree replacements.

Landscape Improvement Projects:

- Acquired entry signage easement at Buttonbush & Young Road, SL#80
- Checked into cost to trench under road vs. boring under road for future irrigation connections.

Street Lights:

• The board looked into costs associated with installing acorn style street lights with underground electric. To install 117 Acorn Style street lights, one every 75' for proper photo metrics, would have an approximate unit cost of \$8250.00 per light post, which translates into \$965,250.00 to install a complete street light system in Springbrook Reserve.

#### Mailbox Upgrades and Replacement Program

In the fall of 2007 ballots were mailed out to the Springbrook Reserve property owners fore cast aluminum replacement mailboxes and mail posts. The result of the vote: 59 property owners cast a ballot and out of those votes there were 35 No's & 24 Yes's. The replacement Mailbox/ Mail Post ballot failed because there was not a 65% yes vote.

The homeowners present at the annual meeting expressed concern that a replacement Mailbox/mail post needs to be determined. Because several homeowners have requested that the board make a recommendation attached is the boards replacement mailbox and mail post recommendation.

### Landscape Capital Improvement Project 2008

Six years have passed since the establishment of the Springbrook Reserve subdivision. In 2008 the first community landscape improvement project will occur in our community. At the Call Road and Shining Willow entry a mirrored image of the "Springbrook Reserve" monument entry sign and landscaping will be installed. The budget for this project is \$15,000.

### Uniform Trash Pick-Up Program by Fruth

In an effort to improve safety, reduce wear and tear on the roads and achieve a lower unit cost per residence, the SR-HOA-BOD acquired quotes from several of the local trash collection companies. The company that offered the best rate was Fruth Sanitation Inc. They are offering Springbrook Reserve residents a quarterly trash pick fee of \$54.50 (includes \$9.00 for recycling).
